








Wolf Distribution in Poland

≈ 950 wolves in Poland








Lynx Distribution

≈ 200 lynx






Localization of Animal Passes

Protection of biodiversity by implementation ecological corridors network in Poland

- Timeframe: 2014 2016
- Reviev of existing corridors national and international
- identification of problematic areas, spatial planning documents
- aktualization of maps
- Designation of afforestation areas
- Designation of alternative variant of corridors
- Elimination of barriers in continuity of corridors
- Professional database types and localization of animal passes, public access
- Guidelines- designating local and national corridors


